Rational

Bletchley Park Primary School's Good Standing Policy is underpinned by the Minister's Statement on Violence in School "Let's Make a Stand Together", our Managing Student Behaviour Policy and the school philosophy.

At Bletchley Park Primary we support a culture of respect and believe that all students have the right to feel safe, nurtured and supported at school. We have high behaviour expectations underpinned by positive interpersonal relationships.

Aim

Reward students who consistently exhibit exemplary behaviour.

Establish a set of consequences for individuals who do not accept their responsibilities and breach the school's Behaviour Management Policy, so that they are encouraged to recognise and respect the rights of others.

Definition

Good Standing is the right of an individual to fully participate in the schools extra curricula programs. It is the responsibility of students to maintain their Good Standing

All students commence with and retain Good Standing while exhibiting behaviours that align with the school values as outlined in the Supporting Student Behaviour Policy.

Responsibilities

Administration

- Communicate in a professional manner relevant behavioural information to other staff, parents and external agencies
- Teach and model desired behaviours expected of staff and students
- Support and communicate with teachers on attendance/behavioural issues
- Provide support structures for staff to assist implementation of the school Behaviour Management Plan
- Provide end of line management techniques i.e. case conferences
- Inform parents of acceptable behaviours and severe breaches of the school behavioural plan
- Induct new students and staff (including relief teachers) into class and school behavioural programs
- Provide immediate support for serious incidents (use a Red Card)
- Access support agencies e.g. School Psychologist, Attendance Officer

Staff

- Consistently apply the school's Behaviour Management Plan
- Establish, in consultation with students, the classroom rules and display
- Teach and model expected and unexpected behaviours
- Maintain accurate attendance and behaviour records in tracking books and on INTEGRIS
- Notify parents of students who are at risk of losing their Good Standing

Students

- Comply with the school and classroom rules
- Follow instructions when given by staff

Acknowledging Good Standing

All students that maintain their Good Standing will be eligible to participate in a Good Standing Events held at the school. These events could include, but not restricted to, disco, arts and crafts, scavenger hunt, games morning, water day, movie day,

Will receive a letter inviting them to the Good Standing Event and recognising their exemplary behaviour.

Reasons for Loss of Good Standing

- Progress through the school's Behaviour Management Plan
- Inappropriate behaviour whilst representing the school in extra-curricular activities
- Non-adherence to Individual Engagement Plans (IEP) or Individual Behaviour Management Plans (IBMP)
- **Suspension** will result in immediate loss of Good Standing
- Intentionally attack, or instigate a fight with, another student
- Film fighting between students

Consequences for Loss of Good Standing

- Students who lose their Good Standing may have privileges removed, such as attending non-curricular events.
- Students who lose their Good Standing in any term may not be eligible to attend Good Standing events.

Re-instate Good Standing

- Good Standing can be re-instated after completing a ten (10) day period of good behaviour during which students use a daily tracking sheet monitored by the classroom teacher and relevant Deputy.
- Implement a restorative and educative return to school process to re-establish positive behaviour.
- Develop a re-entry and/or individual behaviour plan focusing on the identified areas for improvement citing strategies, milestones and desired outcomes.
- A student's Good Standing after such period will be reinstated by the Principal; parents will be notified.
