

FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Welcome back to term three, one of the busiest terms in the school calendar. Thank you to Ms Salmon who filled in as principal in my absence, she did a great job and enjoyed the role a little too much. Long service leave was great and if you ever get the opportunity to visit either Ireland or Scotland, do it. Also, thank you to Mrs Roth who did a great job filling in for Ms Salmon as DP.

There are two important bits of information for the community around Violence in Schools and Working with Children Checks and volunteering on a school site. Please contact me if you have questions in regards to either of these policies.

Swimming lessons commence next week for our Yr 4-6 students followed by our PP-Yr 3 students. These are very busy times involving multiple bus trips, pool entries etc. Please make sure you are aware of when your child's class is at swimming and ensure they have their bathers and a dry towel each day. We encourage all students to attend these free lessons as learning to swim is a very valuable life skill, especially in the WA climate. To accommodate swimming lessons, normal class timetables also get adjusted during this time, so your child may have science etc on a different day.

A number of sporting events occur this term. Inter school cross country along with athletics carnivals to name but a few. This year we will be trialling a whole school athletics carnival Kindy – Yr 6 on Friday 8th September. More information will follow in coming weeks.

Our school choir, led by the amazing Mrs Watson, sang magnificently at our recent assembly and will be attending the One Big Voice event on Friday 18th August at RAC Arena. I am confident they will enjoy the experience. The Yirra Yaakin incursion funded by the school (postponed from last term) will be performing in Week 5. We will also celebrate Book Week on Friday 1st September so start hunting out your favourite book and planning your costume.

As we continue to implement the strategies around Digital Technology in our Business Plan, on the 1st of August we will be holding an information session for 2024 Yr 5 parents to explain BYOD (bring your own device). This is a program we have implemented at BPPS to ensure students have access to 1:1 iPads and develop the appropriate digital skills to operate successfully in society. We have a parent open afternoon on Wednesday 13th of September, when students will showcase what they have achieved over the year and on the 14th of September we will celebrate RUOK day.

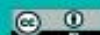

Working With Children Changes to Regulations

Dear Parents / Guardians

We are grateful to all the parents who generously volunteer their time and energy to support our school community. I am writing to inform you of an important change to the Working with Children Check legislation, which helps keep our students safe.

This change applies to parents who volunteer. You will need to sign a 'Parent and child volunteer declaration form' before volunteering or continuing to volunteer at our school. You cannot volunteer if you have a current Working with Children Negative Notice or Interim Negative Notice.

Volunteering includes, for example:

- helping with reading or attending a day excursion
- presenting an award at an assembly
- on canteen duty or assisting at a sports carnival
- conducting P&C and School Board duties.

Volunteering does not include, for example:

- picking up and dropping off your child
- watching an event, like a school assembly
- attending a parent and teacher interview, parent open afternoon
- visiting the uniform shop.

When you attend the school to volunteer, you will sign in at the front office and we will ask you to complete the form. You will be asked to complete the form annually if you want to continue volunteering at the school. If your circumstances change, and you are issued with a Negative Notice or Interim Negative Notice after you complete the form, you need to notify me and stop volunteering immediately.

A current Working with Children Check is required by all other family members and friends over 18 years of age who want to volunteer.

We believe these changes will contribute to maintaining a safe environment for all our students. We look forward to continuing our partnership as we work together to keep our students safe.

Checks for parent volunteers in schools

We are grateful for and value our parent volunteers – here’s how you can help keep our children safe when doing unpaid work at your child’s school.

Before you volunteer at your child’s school, you need to **complete a Parent and child volunteer declaration form**. You will be asked to complete the form annually if you want to continue volunteering.

 <p>You are volunteering</p>	<p>When you:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • help out in a classroom or attend a day excursion • present an award or speak at an assembly • are on canteen duty or helping in the uniform shop • assist at a sports carnival • conduct P&C duties.
 <p>You are not volunteering</p>	<p>When you:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • pick up and drop off your child • watch an event, like an assembly or sports carnival • attend a parent and teacher interview • visit the uniform shop.
 <p>You cannot volunteer</p>	<p>When you:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • have a current Interim Negative Notice or Negative Notice • have submitted the form and are issued an Interim Negative Notice or Negative Notice – you must alert the principal.
<p>In addition to the declaration form, you need a Working with Children (WWC) Check</p>	
 <p>You need a WWC Check</p>	<p>When you:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • volunteer for an overnight camp • billet students in your home • provide one-on-one mentoring to a student.

A current WWC Check is required by all other family members and friends (over 18 years of age) who want to volunteer.

If you are not sure if you need a WWC Check or to complete the Parent and child volunteer declaration form, please speak with the school office staff.

Each child expresses and receives love through one of 5 different communication styles.
