School needs to consider the reason for homework To prepare for high school? - For parents to know what's going on in classrooms? - To consolidate learning? Change No Homework to a flexible homework policy. Consultation with staff required. B) Music Program - currently Music is only taught until Year 2 - School is looking at a different approach in 2022 and beyond One possible idea is to provide 6 mths of music and 6 months of visual arts from P-6. This is a management decision to be discussed at Leadership team level.
